

DOCUMENTS TO BE COLLECTED FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICATIONS

Below is a list of the documents we require for international student applications in order to proceed with signing them up for the Opportunities International package:

IDENTIFICATION:

- Passport
- Birth Certificate – notarized copy
- Driver's License and/or National ID Card – notarised copy

PROOF OF QUALIFICATIONS:

- International Qualifications – A notarized copy of their academic transcripts, Graduation Certificates, and/or letter or statement from the institution of study outlining their academics.
- Australian qualifications - A notarized copy of their academic transcripts, Educational Certificate (Degree, Diploma, etc.), or statement from the Australian institution of study outlining their academics.

PROOF OF EMPLOYMENT:

- Proof of employment – your current or most recent employment which includes payslips or a contract. You can also attach your most recent curriculum vitae or résumé. Your curriculum vitae or résumé should include employment and educational history.
- A copy of your Resume to show your employment history.

RELATIONSHIP STATUS:

- If you are married you will need to provide proof of your relationship by showing a marriage certificate, family photographs, or joint bills. This is only needed if the student wants to bring their spouse with them. There is no need for this part if they are traveling by themselves.

CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECK

- Applicants will need a criminal history check

IF APPLICANTS ARE COMING FROM VENEZUELA THE FOLLOWING EXTRA INFORMATION IS REQUIRED:

EVIDENCE OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE ABILITY

- If the student speaks English or has studied English before, a certificate of proof is needed. If this can't be provided, then the student will need to enrol in an English course. It is strongly advised that they enrol in an English course, either way, to increase the probability of visa application approval.

FINANCIAL CAPACITY:

- If students come from Venezuela, they will need to provide proof of funding. This is a bank statement, loan agreement, or a letter showing they have financial support. Please note the funding needs to be under the applicants' name to be accepted by immigration.
